Future simple

- We use **will + infinitive** for things we decide to do as we are speaking.



Bye John!
I`ll call you later.

Will – predictions

➤ I **will** have a cup of coffee, please.



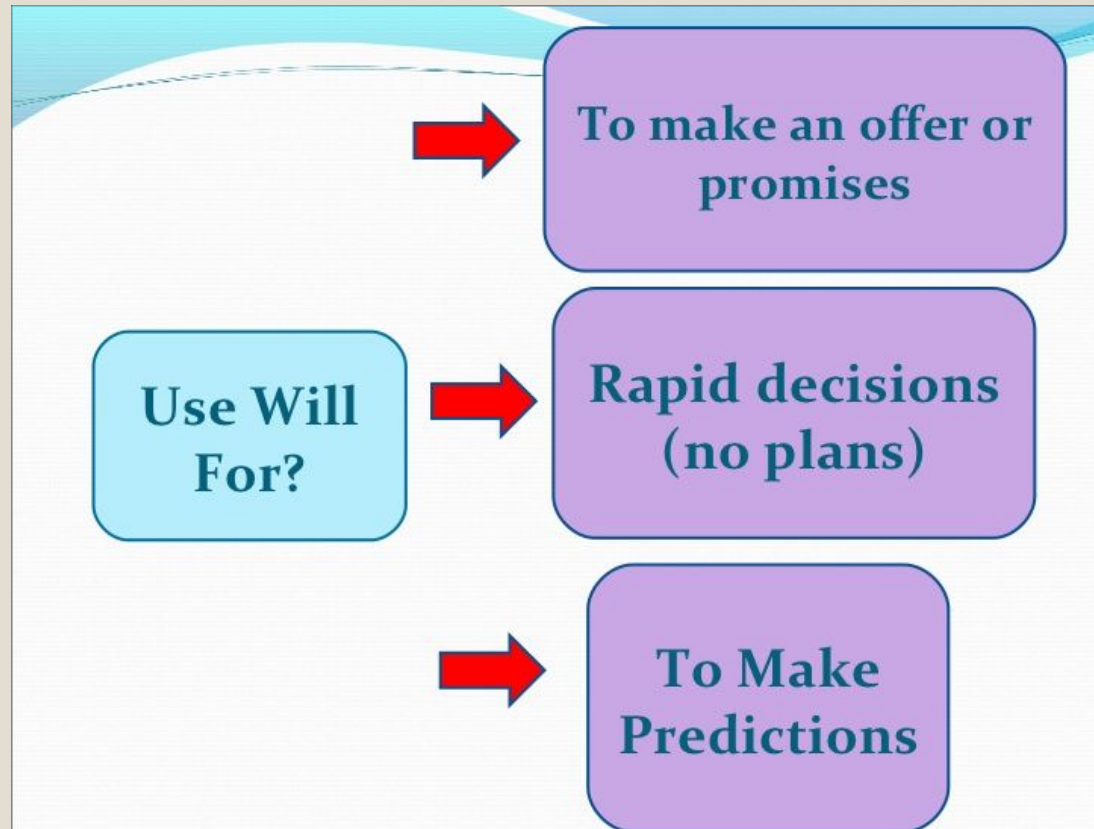

Today, I **am going to** read my favourite novel, then I **am going to** phone my best friend and finally I **am going to** drive my new motorcycle.



Going to - Predictions

PREDICTIONS WITH PRESENT EVIDENCE



Look at those black clouds!
It's **going to** rain.

She is pregnant.
She's **going to** have a baby.



Going to - functions

“Be going to “

- We use “be going to”
- For plans , intentions or ambitions for the future

She is going to become a doctor when she grows up.

- Actions we have already decided to do in the near future


Paul is going to visit his aunt this weekend.


Going to vs will - predicitions

Use "Be going to" to make a prediction based on some evidence (something that you see or know):

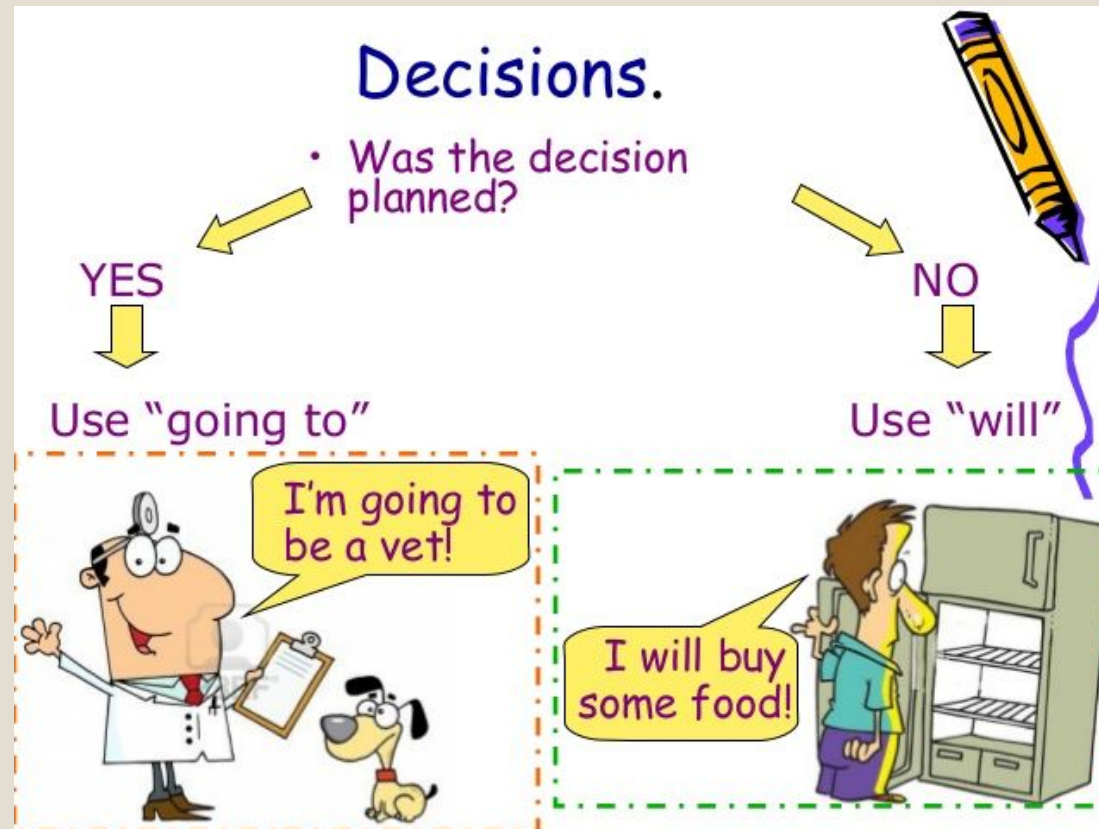


"Fernando Alonso is going to win the race!"

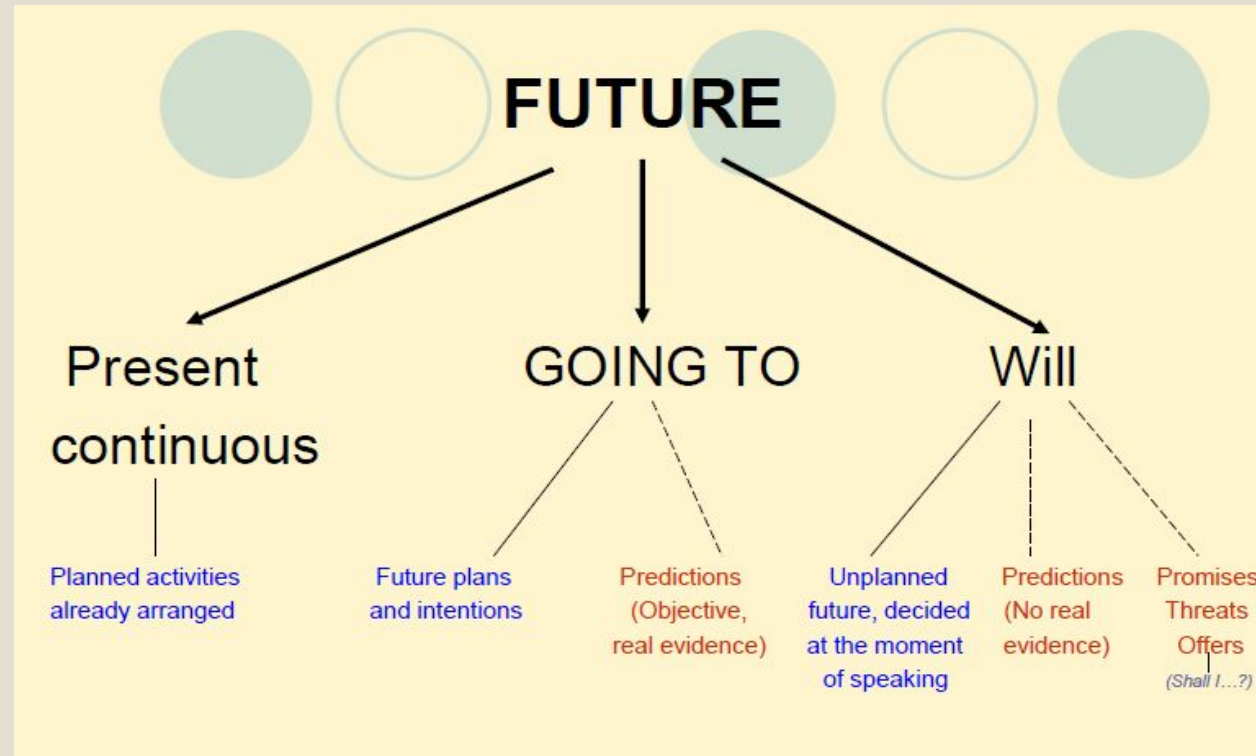


"This boy is going to fall down the tree!"

examples

We're going to go on a virtual tour.

The intelligent home will generate its own electricity.

We probably won't live in an intelligent home.

Our children might live in one

Functions

GRAMMAR – going to, will, might

Future intention <i>going to</i>	We're going to go on a virtual tour.
Future fact <i>will/won't</i>	The intelligent home will generate its own electricity.
Future prediction <i>will (probably)/ (probably) won't</i>	We probably won't live in an intelligent home.
Future possibility <i>might</i>	Our children might live in one
