the Saxons, from North Germany and the Jutes, from Northern Denmark, invade Britain and establish a society organized around clans or tribes.




In this society there is a king at the top; there are noble warriors below the king, farmers working for these warriors and slaves at the bottom. Religion is based on many gods, like Woden, Thunor, Frig and Tiw.



These gods are those of the Vikings, Scandinavian warriors who arrive in Great Britain towards the end of the 8th century and conquer the country.



Viking men work as farmers, craftsmen and traders while women work in the house; children help their parents and learn about history, law and religion.


