Be going to future

Forma affermativa

Soggetto + v. "to be" coniugato + *going to* + v. forma base

I am going to read

We are going to read

You are going to read

You are going to read

He, she, it is going to read

They are going to read

Forma negativa

Soggetto + v. "to be" coniugato + NOT + *going to* + v. forma base

I am NOT going to read
You are NOT going to read
He, she, it is NOT going to read

We are NOT going to read
You are NOT going to read
They are NOT going to read

Forma interrogativa

V. "to be" coniugato + soggetto + *going to* + v. forma base

Am I going to eat?
Are you going to eat?
Is he, she, it going to eat?

Are we going to eat?
Are you going to eat?
Are they going to eat?

Si usa il *“be going to” future* per:

1) Parlare di qualcosa che si ha intenzione di fare:

E.g. I am going to buy that jacket =
Ho intenzione di comprare quel giubbotto.

E.g. I am going to eat at KFC soon. =
Ho intenzione di andare a mangiare da KFC presto.

I am going to play football this afternoon.

Are you going to do fencing tonight? = Hai intenzione di fare scherma stasera?

Are you going to go to the centre?

Are you going to see the new James Bond movie? =

Hai intenzione di guardare il nuovo film di James Bond?

He is not going to study for the exam. He's too optimistic. = Lui non ha intenzione di studiare in vista dell'esame. È troppo ottimista.

We are not going to go out tonight. It's too cold outside.

Are they going to come with us?

She is not going to buy a new house.

2) Per fare previsioni sulla base di informazioni disponibili/che si hanno a disposizione nel presente:

E.g. Look at those clouds! It's going to rain! =

Guarda quelle nuvole! Pioverà!

E.g. It's late! My mum is going to be upset! =
È tardi! Mia mamma si arrabbierà!

You are driving too fast. You're going to crash. =
Corri troppo veloce con la macchina. Ti schianterai.

He hasn't studied enough. He's not going to pass the exam. =
Lui non ha studiato abbastanza. Non passerà l'esame.
