Si usa if + Past Simple + would per parlare del presente e immaginare una situazione diversa da quella attuale. Questa costruzione si chiama periodo ipotetico di secondo tipo (= the Second Conditional):

Un altro esempio è qualcuno che non ha abbastanza denaro per comprare una nuova macchina e dice:



I'd buy a new car if I had enough money. Nota che non si mette la virgola prima di if. 🌌 Si può usare lo stesso tipo di frase per parlare di una situazione improbabile nel futuro:

If + PAST SIMPLE	+ would/'d
If I won a lot of money,	I' d buy a big house.
(= Se vincessi molti soldi, comprerei una casa grande.)	

- Nota le forme negative con didn't e wouldn't: If I didn't live in Italy, I'd like to live in America. If more people used public transport, there wouldn't be so much pollution.
- Si possono usare might e could invece di would:

If I didn't have other plans, I **could** come with you. (= ..., potrei ...)

If he told someone his problems, he **might** feel better. (= ... è possibile che si senta meglio.)

Dopo if, si può usare were con I/he/she/it: If I were (OPPURE was) a racing driver, I'd drive for Ferrari. (= Se fossi un pilota, correrei per la Ferrari.)

If he were taller, he could join the police.

Was è più usato nell'inglese colloquiale.

Spesso si usa l'espressione If I were you (= Se fossi in te) per dare un consiglio a qualcuno:

If I were you, I'd go to the police. (NON If I was you, ...)
