



Who? e What?: pronomi interrogativi soggetto e complemento

1 Confronta questi esempi:

 <p style="text-align: center;">SOGGETTO</p> <p>ANN: Who told you? MARY: James told me.</p> <p>Questa è una interrogativa con pronome soggetto.</p>	 <p style="text-align: center;">COMPLEMENTO</p> <p>ANN: Who did you tell? MARY: I told Bill.</p> <p>Questa è una interrogativa con pronome complemento.</p>
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2 Confronta le frasi con il pronome interrogativo **Who** soggetto e complemento:

<p>Nella frase 'Who told you?' Who è il soggetto. Ecco un altro esempio:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">SOGGETTO</p> <p>ANN: Who wrote Hamlet? (Qualcuno ha scritto Hamlet. Chi?) MARY: Shakespeare wrote Hamlet</p> <p>Quando Who è il soggetto, l'ordine delle parole è lo stesso di una frase affermativa:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">SOGGETTO</p> <p>Who is going to come with me? Who lives in that old house? Who wants some more coffee?</p>	<p>Nella frase Who did you tell?, Who è il complemento. Ecco un altro esempio:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">COMPLEMENTO</p> <p>ANN: Who did you meet last night? (Tu hai incontrato qualcuno. Chi?) MARY: I met a couple of friends.</p> <p>Quando Who è il complemento, si usa un ausiliare (be, do, have ecc.) prima del soggetto:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">COMPLEMENTO</p> <p>Who are you going to invite? Who did Laura ask for help? Who have you told about this?</p>
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3 Confronta le interrogative con il pronome **What** soggetto e complemento:

<p style="text-align: center;">SOGGETTO</p> <p>What is in this dish? (C'è qualcosa. Che cosa?)</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">COMPLEMENTO</p> <p>What did you buy at the shops? (Tu hai comprato qualcosa. Che cosa?)</p>

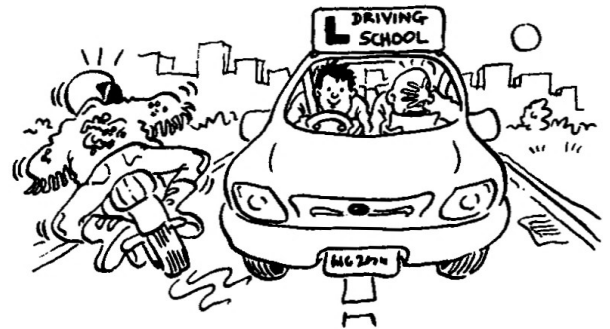
ANSWERS

- 1 ~ Anita and Frank (went on the trip).
- 2 ~ I'm not sure (what's happening in this film).
- 3 ~ (I'm going to phone) Jane.
- 4 ~ (I watched) that new comedy programme (on TV last night).
- 5 ~ John (sent these flowers).
- 6 ~ (I bought) a book (in that shop).
- 7 ~ Some good news (has made Tom so happy).

- 0 (What/Robert/do/two days ago?)
What did Robert do two days ago? ~ He took his driving test.
- 1 (What/happen?) ~ He failed it.
- 2 (Who/take/his/driving test?) ~ Robert.
- 3 (What/Robert/fail?) ~ His driving test.
- 4 (What/Robert/say/to Philip?) ~ He said, 'Don't tell anyone.'
- 5 (Who/meet/Linda/for coffee?) ~ Philip.
